Dutch Council of Women

- An umbrella organisation by and for women's organisations
- Founded in 1898
- NVR has more than 55 member organizations
- A wide variety of organizations
- Purpose is to enhance the position of women in the Netherlands

European & International context

NVR member EWL and ECICW

Has a representative at the observatory on violence against women of the EWL

On international level NVR is a member of the International Council of Women (ICW)

Furthermore, NVR has an NGO-status to the Economic and Social Council of the United Nations (ECOSOC)

Examples of Activities and Projects

Concerning women's empowerment, leadership, women's rights and violence against women

Elections – The NVR has an online campaign www.kiezeenvrouw.nl = “vote for a woman”

De Nieuwe Toekomst – Empowerment of (ex-)victims of domestic violence: building a new future through a course and coaching trajectory, leading the women to active participation in society

More Examples

Vrouwenpodium – Every year in September the NVR organizes a meeting between politicians and women about different subjects

‘UN resolution 1325’: The NVR is signatory to the 2 National Action Plans that were developed in The Netherlands on UNSCR 1325

Commission on the Status of Women (CSW): Each year the NVR makes it possible for women representatives to participate in the CSW

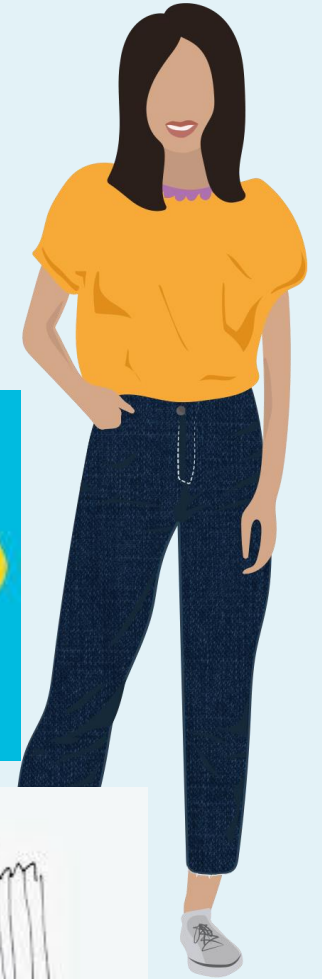
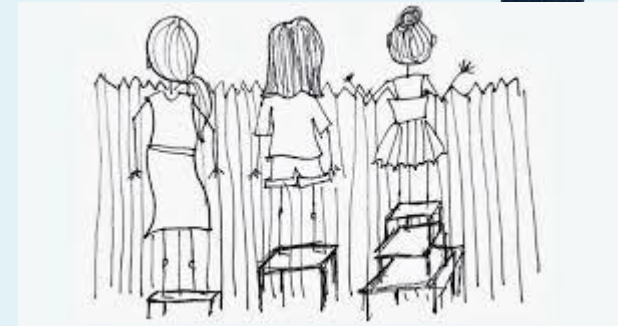
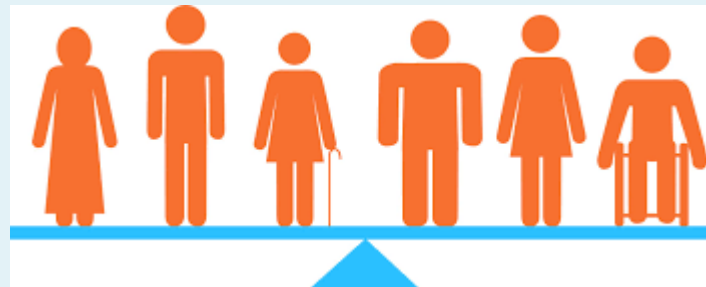
