## **BEST PRACTICES EXCHANGE CONTRASTING GENDER GAP**

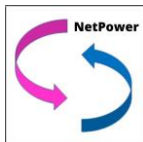

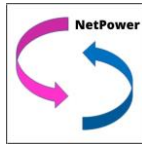
